- Over 580 signatures were gathered for the proposition to increase funding to the Round Lake Library; next step will be to educate the voters of Malta to promote the vote. (Let her know if you would like XL t-shirts that are leftover to promote the library. She also has some card stock that can be put in the back window of the car - more effective towards October.)
- Sara Dallas, director of SALS attended the Board of Trustees meeting and presented their five year Plan of Service.
- Nelson Beebe's contract was renewed for accounting services.
- Several trustees worked the VERY successful book sale.
- Nancy handed out sheets of the Round Lake Library 2017 Proposed Budget, one sheet an "Increase", the other "No Increase" for the members review and approval. She gave a synopsis of the differences between the two "increase" and "no increase". Being that this is a "Proposed Budget" she asked that the sheets be returned after their perusal. Maggie McDonough made a motion to approve the "No Increase" budget. It was seconded by Tom Bergin and unanimously approved with no abstentions. Lydia Hoffman made a motion to approve the "Increase" budget. It was seconded by Maggie McDonough and unanimously approved with no abstentions. (Proposed Budgets attached)

Programs:

 Deb Albrecht stated that it was a very successful event which so far has netted a profit of \$927.34. She may have to make some revisions to her report since some receipts have yet to be tallied.
- Antiques Festival. Lance Spallholz will have a written report at the next meeting.
- Markets of Round Lake. Deb Albrecht thanked everyone, especially Department of Public Works. They were extremely helpful in the set up. Markets of Round Lake Co-Chairs Eva Sackal and Kim Sheridan took on a tremendous undertaking to make the old Arts and Crafts Festival a new and revitalizing event.
 - Other volunteers, Courtney Max, Amy Leach, Corliss Robichaud, and Sharyn Marchione thank you! Nancy Theissen also thanked Deb Albrecht! Applause had for all!!
 - Deb Albrecht gave a brief summary not prepared for full numbers but, book sales were more than \$3,200; kids crew \$198; raffles \$327; pies \$756; sales info booth \$929; returned bottles \$4.35. *Thank you from WRLIS!!!*
- Deb Albrecht wanted to submit the following:

 "Summary of Markets of Round Lake Over the weekend of August 13th and 14th,

 WRLIS held the first annual Markets of Round Lake, a fundraiser for the Round

 Lake Library. We had four markets, including artisanal food and beverages,

 indie-craft markets, and a used book market. There were a total of 75 vendors.

 The event was well attended, the parking lots were full. The consumable food

vendors sold out of food. Most vendors were thrilled by the level of sales they obtained during this event. There were no major issues with the level of noise created by the live music nor with consumable alcohol sales at the event. The attendees were well controlled and respectful of Village property. By having the event in the center of the Village, we were able to provide shade on the hottest day of the year, provide more space for the attendees to walk around, and to use the high ground which did not become overly muddy after heavy rain. We were also able to highlight what a unique and wonderful experience the Village of Round Lake is. Also by bringing the event into the Village, we were able to almost double the revenue from the annual Round Lake Library book sale." (Summary attached)
