## **Committee Reports**

**Buildings**: submitted by Steve Peterson. The front porch door handle continues to come loose from the spindle. Applied Loktite to set screw. A bird family has taken up residence in the rotten eave above Jen Hurd's office. Repairs will start once the hatchlings leave the nest. A Round Lake resident has offered to help Steve repair the eave. The plan is to apply a wood rot stabilizer, then fill the holes with wood putty, sand and paint. The upstairs air filters were replaced.

**Grounds**: The Garden Ladies have removed the weeds at the front of Clark House and replanted with thyme. 3 metal benches were repainted.

**Improvements:** Merry reported that volunteers have cumulatively spent 48 hours pulling garlic mustard.

The Library/Auditorium signs have been ordered. DPW will install them on the utility posts at Burlington/Asbury and Burlington/Fletcher.

Molly Stammel has stepped down from organizing/planning the pet memorial. Anyone interested in pursuing this project should contact Merry.

There will be a trash clean-up along Curry Road/Round Lake Road from Leah's to Dunkin Donuts on June 28 from 10:00 - 11:30. Bring bright color vests and rubber gloves. Meet at Leah's. The plan is to go to lunch afterwards.

## **Festivals:**

## **Old Business:**

Paint & Sip: Nancy reported that all 30 slots were filled. The event netted \$430.

**Amy Brader Leach memorial:** Merry has contacted Eric Leach about his preference for WRLIS' use of the money donated.

**Victorian Landings entryway landscaping:** Rachel contacted her son Colin Roy, who recommended laser blasting or sanding to restore the shine to the lettering on the entryway sign. Rachel will ask Colin to provide contact information to Merry.

**Library Gallery:** A new coordinator is needed. The coordinator is responsible for contacting the artists, mounting their work on the walls and following up with the artists to pick up their work after the exhibit.

Book on Round Lake: no update.

#### **New Business:**

Removal of tree from Library Lawn: Jen reported that the arborist has advised that the tree on the library lawn outside 2 First Street needs to be cut down. Jen obtained 3 bids - \$2700, \$2300 and \$2200. All three quotes include removing the stump. Jen recommends going with Donovan Tree Service — who had the quote for \$2200. Donovan Tree Service was recommended by John Stevenson, Round Lake Superintendent for Public Works/Parks & Rec/Highway. The library will pay the expense because it is on library property. Maggie moved to spend up to \$2200 to remove the tree and stump. Dick Theissen seconded. The motion was approved with 2 abstentions. Jen will contact Donovan Tree Service about the deposit and timing for removal.

If the Library Trustees want to add another tree on library lawn, they can contact the tree committee to inquire about their future planting plans.
