Antiques Festival June 21 – 22: no report

Night of Illumination June 21: Nancy presented the report for the 20th Night of Illumination. The Honoree was Amy Brader Leach. The Tower Bell was rung for the first time in 2 years. **report attached.* A written income and expenses recap sheet was given to Tim Lesar. Net profit was \$2,932.17.

Markets at Round Lake August 9-10: no report.

Old Business:

Amy Brader Leach memorial: Eric suggested using the money donated to purchase bulbs to be planted around the labyrinth and in other areas of the park so that there would be spring blooms that would naturalize.

Victorian Landings entryway landscaping: In late August/early September, Colin Roy will be restoring the shine on the Round Lake plaque at Victorian Landings. The Village will pay for this. Once the lettering is restored, Victorian Landings can complete their plantings.

Removal of tree from Library Lawn: The arborist cancelled the tree removal scheduled for August 21 because his machine broke. The removal will be rescheduled.

Library Gallery: There is someone from Malta League of Arts who would be willing to work with someone from the Village to display the art. The Village coordinator would need to contact the artists.

Book on Round Lake: no update.

New Business:

Library Budget: Nancy presented the 2026 Library budget. The Library board approved the budget at their August meeting and now it needs to be approved by WRLIS. Elizabeth Brock moved to accept the Library budget for 2026. Maggie seconded. The motion passed. *budget attached

Victorian Landings: no report.

Griffin's Ridge: 7 homes buffer the water retention ponds. The foliage is growing around the ponds and homeowners have been removing invasives and installing other plants. Mark Marion of the Tree Committee held a question and answer session about the health of the water retention ecosystem and what should be removed from the surrounding berm to deter the invasive plants
